



# **RULES FOR THE JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP OF CONFECTIONERS UNDER 25 18-20 SEP 2018 Munich - Germany**

## **♣ Article 1**

The UIBC Junior World Championship is a benchmark test of upcoming talents in the confectionery trade. Within the scope of this World Championship upcoming talents shall be encouraged and the image of this craft shall be made well-known to a broad public.

## **♣ Article 2**

The Junior World Championship is organised every two years in years with even dates. The UIBC Congress decides upon the venue. The organisation of this competition is incumbent upon the member state appointed by the UIBC. The execution can be conferred to an organising committee; the member association however retains overall responsibility. Six months before the competition takes place, the Presidium of UIBC has to accept the detailed concept presented by the organising member association. The World Championship is under the patronage of the UIBC, the General Secretariat coordinates the organisation and is responsible for the invitation of entries and registration procedure.

## **♣ Article 3**

Each country takes part with a maximum of two confectioners. These two confectioners must be determined in a national competition. Both participants work independently. On January 1<sup>st</sup> of the Competition Year, the participants must not exceed the age of 25. Participants may only participate once in the Junior World Championship for under 25.

## **♣ Article 4**

Member associations receive the relevant documents for the competition at least eight months in advance. The deadline for registrations is the 15<sup>th</sup> November 2017.

The registration has to be submitted by the member association through the [ONLINE REGISTRATION FORM](#). The registration must include a personal CV (including the participant's professional career), as well as evidence of the participant's age. Documents with illustrated recipes of the participant's own competition work have to be submitted to the jury on the first day of the competition.

The General Secretary verifies the incoming registrations and grants the admission to the competition according to the order of the registrations.



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## **♣ Article 5**

The competition work to be performed at the event is announced together with the other documents of the competition and is available on the UIBC web page.

For each Junior World Championship the work that has to be carried out by the competitors is newly defined.

## **♣ Article 6**

The costs for board and lodging of the competitors and the members of the jury have to be covered by the organising member association.

## **♣ Article 7**

Venue, date, time and agenda of the competition are announced to the competitors by the General Secretary following confirmation of their registration. Moreover competitors receive a list detailing the available equipment and raw materials as annexed to the rules of competition. Equipment and raw materials that are not included in this annex have to be brought along by the competitors.

## **♣ Article 8**

The competitor ranked first receives a cup and 1200 €.

The competitor ranked second receives a cup and 800 €.

The competitor ranked third receives a cup and 500 €.

All participants receive a medal of participation with a certificate.

## **♣ Article 9**

Each participating country appoints one member of the jury. The jury member must be appointed together with the appointment of the competitor(s) by the member association.

Jury members have to possess relevant professional experience and be active in this vocational field. The jury member must be able to speak English or accompanied by a professionally experienced translator.

Jury members may not judge participants of their own country. Experience in national competitions or in auditing is a precondition for the appointment as a member of the jury.

The UIBC Presidium appoints the chief expert twelve months in advance.

The chief expert coordinates the briefing and supervision of the participants and the assessment of the work performed. He/She introduces the jury members to their tasks. To this purpose, an evaluation system, which has been approved by the UIBC Presidium, is in.



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The organising member association appoints one expert who supervises the workshop and assists the chief expert. This expert is responsible for equipment, hygiene and raw materials.

Remuneration of the members of the jury is the responsibility of the respective participating countries.

## **♣ Article 10**

The organisers reserve the right to decide upon the publication of recipes, photos and/or films of the work produced.

## **♣ Article 11**

Access to the rooms where the competition is held is only granted to competitors, jury members, the President and the Secretary General of the UIBC and the assigned auxiliary personnel. Access control is ensured by the organisers.

## **♣ Article 12**

The competitors are required to wear working clothes. The organisers reserve the right to stipulate that emblems of sponsors have to be affixed to the clothing.

## **♣ Article 13**

The jury's decision is not challengeable.
